It's the most wonderful time of the year! We're entering into one my favorite times of the calendar year as well as the church year. Throughout December, the church finds itself in the Advent season which culminates at Christmas.

Advent comes from the Latin term adventus, which means "coming," which is a translation of the Greek word parousia, which commonly refers to the second coming of Christ in the New Testament. Advent lasts four Sundays in which we celebrate the first coming of Christ. We remember and rejoice in how God's love and grace was manifested in Christ Jesus, born in a manger in Bethlehem all those years ago.

But this is not the only reason the church observes Advent. We also wait for the return of Christ in glory. Throughout the four Sundays in Advent, we read Old Testament passages, especially from the prophets, who wrote of Israel in exile, waiting, hoping and expecting the coming of Jesus. The New Testament readings throughout Advent see the church is in a similar situation. We live our lives with the hope and expectation that Christ will come again.

This can be difficult to keep in mind while we revel in holiday celebrations and in the midst of shopping, all the lights and decorations and singing Christmas carols. I charge you to take the time to reflect this Advent season and remember God's grace and love in Christ Jesus. May we also live a life that anticipates Christ's return: do justice, love mercy, and walk humbly with our God.




THANK YOU PASTOR DAVID

Our beautiful organ has been repaired by Glen Tallar (seated at the organ) and his crew. We appreciate his tender loving care in restoring our treasure.


The pipes are once again singing worship and praise to our Lord, just in time for the Christmas season. Join us this Christmas. Thank you Glen!


